

Expected Y1 level in Reading

- Use known phonics to read new words.
- Read tricky words on sight in books.
- Re-read if reading does not make sense.
- Link what they read about to their own experiences.
- Re-tell a story with accuracy.
- Make predictions on basis of what has been read.
- Make inferences on basis of what is being said and done.
- Read aloud with pace and expression, i.e. pause at full stop; raise voice for question.
- Recognise:
 - capital letters
 - full stops
 - question marks
 - exclamation marks
 - ellipsis
- Know why the writer has used the above punctuation in a text.
- Know difference between fiction and non-fiction texts.

Expected Y1 level in Writing

- Write clearly demarcated sentences.
- Use 'and' to join ideas.
- Use conjunctions to join sentences (e.g. so, but).
- Introduce use of:
 - capital letters
 - full stops
 - question marks
 - exclamation marks
- Use capital letters for names and personal pronoun 'I'.
- Write a short sequence of sentences.
- Use correct formation of lower case letters – finishing in right place.
- Use correct formation of capital letters.
- Use correct formation of digits.



Expected Y1 level in Mathematics

- Count to and across 100, forwards & backwards from any number.
- Read and write numbers to 20 in numerals & words.
- Read and write numbers to 100 in numerals.
- Recognise place value (tens and units) in numbers beyond 20 (45 = 4 tens and 5 units).
- Say 1 more/1 less to 100.
- Count in multiples of 2, 5 & 10.
- Use number bonds and subtraction facts to 20.
- Add & subtract:
 - 1 digit & 2 digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Solve one-step multiplication and division problems by grouping and sharing objects.
- Recognise half and quarter of object, shape or quantity of objects.
- Use language of day, week, month and year.
- Tell the time to the hour & half past.
