<p><b>Reading:</b> It is really important that your child continues to read as regularly as possible. <p><b>Writing:</b> This week, I would like you to write a letter of persuasion. It is a text that argues a point of view - you are trying to convince the reader to agree with you! I would like you to write a letter to our Prime Minister, Boris Johnson, to persuade him to reopen schools <del>or</del> to keep schools closed for longer - whichever you would like to see happen!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remember to begin your letter with 'Dear...'</li> <li>• Your opening paragraph should explain why you are writing (use because).</li> <li>• The next paragraph should include reasons and points of view for your argument. For example, if you think schools should open again soon, your reasons for this may be because you miss your friends or you believe education is very important. Use capital letters and punctuation, check it makes sense and look for spelling errors.</u></p>

Please continue to practice:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>number bonds to and within 20</li> <li>doubles and halves to 20</li> <li>counting to 100 and back from 0 or any other given number</li> <li>counting in multiples of 2, 3, 5 and 10.</li> </ul> <p>Using and understanding the value of money is really important and something that can be done at home in a practical way. In year 1, children will learn the different values of coins and notes. You could make a pretend shop and give items a price.
